"Faith alone in Christ alone"

WORD OF ENCOURAGEMENT


Undeniably, you are living and operating in the enemy's territory. Scripture makes it clear that Satan is "the god of this world" (John 12:31). Thus our Lord asserts, "you are not of this world" and prayed for your protection (John 17). But, what does the truth that "Satan is the god of this world" mean to you? It means that you are operating in a hostile environment. In Satan's hostility, he has become fierce—outrageously insane—pacing back and forth, "...the devil prowls like a roaring lion, seeking someone [a careless believer] to devour [to tackle; to put out of action]" (I Peter 5:8). What a relief to know that "...greater is He [God] who is in you than he [Satan] who is in the world" (I John 4:4 cf. II Kings 6:8-17). The good news is that you are totally encapsulated by the wall of fire (Zechariah 2:5) as you live and operate in his territory. Satan knows that God has provided you with the most maximum security that Heaven can offer (Job 1:10)! That should be your solace! That's the beauty of God's amazing grace!

As a believer in the Lord Iesus Christ, as long as you are learning and applying His Word on a daily basis, you will enjoy God's maximum security. It's that simple. It boils down to this: There is no system of sophisticated weaponry, no act of terrorism, no attack by Satan—visible or invisible—that can pass unnoticed by God's security and get to you without His sovereign endorsement! Not now, not then, and not ever! He is your Shield (Genesis 15:1)! However, if you have been hit by the enemy's flaming dart, do not fear. Relax. Because God, who allowed it to pass through His sovereign security, is at work right now on your behalf! Again, nothing gets by God without His knowledge. There is absolutely no reason to fall apart, or hit the panic button, or retreat to selfpity—the "why me syndrome." Instead, listen to His words that are sweet to the taste:

"[Happy] is a man who perseveres under [adverse circumstances]; for once he has [passed the spiritual test], he will receive [super abundance of blessing in time, and] the crown of life [in eternity], which the Lord has promised to those who **love** Him [those who have acquired spiritual capacity]" (James 1:12).

James puts it this way: "Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials [when the adversities of life hit you hard, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance [through application of doctrine] have its perfect result, that you may be [fully equipped] lacking in nothing" (James 1:2-4). In fact, what Paul wrote fits perfectly: "And we know that God causes all things [pleasant and unpleasant situations] to work together for good to those who **love** God, to those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). God knows exactly what He is doing in your life; and while you may not be able to fathom all of it, one thing is crystal clear: There is absolutely no such thing as bad luck or an accident in God's plan, because God can blend the bad with good to come up with extraordinarily marvelous results! Essentially, we can face a seemingly bad situation and expect the good that will follow. Such is our awesome God!

Here's the apostle Peter's take on this subject: "But to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing; so that at the revelation of His glory, you may rejoice with exaltation" (I Peter 4:13). Finally, the apostle Paul put it this way: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice!" (Philippians 4:4). Hence, we should rejoice in each and every event in our lives—pleasant or unpleasant, for our Father is at work on our behalf 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year! Allow Job's confidence in God to be yours: "But He knows [what I am going through]; when He has [tested] me, I shall come forth as gold [way better than before!]" (Job 23:10). And no matter what, always remember God's promise: "I will strengthen you, **surely I will help you**, surely I will uphold you with My [integrity]" (Isaiah 41:10c).

DOCTRINE OF GRACE

Taught by Reverend Moses C. Onwubiko Lesson 18

JOSEPH IN THE GRACE FURNACE OF SUFFERING

If you'll recall, we dissected varying degrees of suffering in volume 28, plus we noted that God's grace includes not only a cozy and blissful experience but also going through a furnace of suffering. On the one hand, being purged in the furnace of suffering is inevitable for any believer who is a recipient from the wellspring of God's blessings in time and eternity future. There are no two ways about it! It was inevitable for Job (Job 1, cf. 42:12-16), King David (Psalm 23), the apostle Paul (II Corinthians 11:23-33; cf. II Timothy 4:6-8), and our Lord Jesus Christ for that matter! Yes, the Lord Himself went through the most intense furnace of suffering the world has or will ever know!!

Regarding Christ's unequaled suffering, the author of the book of Hebrews wrote this, "Although He was [God the] Son, He learned obedience through the things He suffered. And by being perfected [refined] in this way, He became the source of eternal salvation to all who [trust in] Him, and He has been designated by God [the Father] as high priest in the order of Melchezidek" (5:8-10 Net Bible). The truth of the matter is, that we might go through a furnace of suffering, but our Lord went through hell on earth to be our substitute! That alone ought to cause the reverence in your soul to expand and to glow by the light of God's majesty. Paradoxically, it goes without saying that to be forewarned is to be forearmed. We can say, with confidence, that the saturation of Joseph's soul with God's Word was all he needed to go through the furnace with flying colors. That's all we need

JOSEPH IN PRISON: Often when things are rugged, a believer is likely to ask, "Why me? Why am I in this predicament?" And yet, when things are running smoothly, no potholes in the road, only a handful of believers (grace-oriented ones) ask, "Why should I be the object of God's blessings?" With this in mind, we are all set to visit Joseph in jail and watch how he applies the doctrine resident in his soul:

In Moses' account we read, "Now it hap-

pened one day that he [Joseph] went into his house to do his work, and none of the men of the household was there inside. And she [Potiphar's wife] caught him by his garment, saving, 'Lie with me!' And he left his garment in her hand and fled and went outside. When she saw that he had left his garment in her hand and had fled outside, she called to the men of her household, and said to them, 'See he [my husband—Potiphar] has brought in a Hebrew to us to make sport of us; he came in to me to lie with me, and I screamed. And it came about when he heard that I raised my voice and screamed, that he left his garment beside me and fled, and went outside.' So she left his garment beside her until his master [her husband] came home. So she spoke to him with these words, 'The Hebrew slave whom you brought to us, came in to me to make sport of |rape| me; and it happened as I raised my voice and screamed, that he left his garment beside me and fled outside" (Genesis 39:11-18).

What a fabricator she was—a good one too! But, unbeknownst to her, her very own accusation, in essence, laid the groundwork for Joseph's promotion through the grace furnace of suffering—where he would be purged from all impurities of arrogance, prepared and strengthened in grace-orientation and humility, prior to receiving the fulfillment of his dream! Though it won't be an easy road, Joseph stands to gain much from the wisdom and the grace of God who vindicates those who suffer unjustly because of their stance in Yahweh!

Potiphar's reaction to his wife's complaint were decisive and swift! "Now it came about when his master heard the words of his wife, which she spoke to him, saying, 'This is what your slave did to me,' that his anger burned [Hebrew: Charah = to be incensed; or to glow with anger]. So Joseph's master took him and put him into the jail, the place where the king's prisoners were confined; and he was there in the jail'" (v. 19, 20). Satan scored another victory. Or did he? In the heat of the moment, it appeared so! It's interesting to note that Potiphar had two options...one was to have Joseph hanged, which would have prevented the fulfillment of his dream. The other was to throw him in jail. God's Providence always prevails and in light of this, he chose the later.

Ironically, the same God who never stopped directing throughout Joseph's entire ordeal of being thrown into a pit, being sold to the Ishmaelites, and enslaved in Egypt, was the very God who prepared a table of grace for Joseph in prison. "But the Lord was with Joseph and extended kindness [unmerited favor] to him, and gave him favor [or Hebrew: chen = grace] in the sight of the chief jailer" (v. 21). We have said it before, but let's say it again, with the words capitalized, italicized, highlighted, underlined, and with double exclamation marks! *THERE IS NOTHING LIKE A BELIEVER BEING THE OBJECT OF GOD'S GRACE!!* There is nothing like it—ever!!!

Conversely, I wish you could see my eyes fixed on your eyes in love, as I make this solemn statement: No created beinghuman or angelic, no circumstance, no amount of propaganda, sickness, suffering or Satan-engineered assault is capable of ending God's plan for your life as long as you are on course! Period. You may say to me, "Moses, you really don't understand the enormity of my suffering." You are absolutely right! The only One who knows, for sure, is the Omniscient God! That's all that matters!! And the truth of the matter is that He never promises us, anywhere in Scripture, that our Christian journey will be a bed of roses; however, He does promise, "I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU" (Hebrews 13:5c). It's that simple!

The evidence of His promise is found in King David's life: "For David, *after* he had served [executed] the purpose [Greek: boule = will or decree of God [for his life] in his own generation, fell asleep [died], and was laid [buried] among his fathers, and underwent decay" (Acts 13:36). This verse of Scripture authenticates our claim. never took His eyes off His servant Davidnot even for a moment—He was always there with him, through all the ups and downs—rugged roads and even in the 'valley of the shadow of death'—God was right there with him—24 hours a day—7 days a week—until he fulfilled God's plan for his life to the last letter! That's true for us too the 'pupil of His eye'—He will never let go of us until we have fulfilled His will for our lives. That's the meaning of God's sovereignty!

God shielded King David from every scourge of the evil one until his job was done; and only then, did God call him home. I don't know about you, but as for me, when God's purpose for my life is complete, I don't want to spend another second on planet earth. So my friend, there are no two ways about it,

if you really understand this truth, there should never be a reason for you to panic, even when the storms of life threaten to toss you overboard. We are now ready for the next installment of Paul's statement: "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28) as its truth applies to Joseph. In fact, we'll see in our study that Joseph made a statement which actually parallels Romans 8:28 when he unveiled himself to his ill-willed and unscrupulous brothers.

JOSEPH'S SECOND PROMOTIONAL **INSTALLMENT IN JAIL**: Nothing is more intriguing or quite as splendid as watching God's faithfulness and His plan for us unfold and bloom like spring flowers along a dusty trail. It's quite awesome to see—there's nothing like it! That is why God's faithfulness is a major part of our study, and it is essential to examine it closely. But first, let's try to imagine Joseph's situation in prison: "And the chief jailer committed to Joseph's charge all the prisoners who were in the jail; so that whatever was done there, he was responsible for it" (Genesis 39:22). You read it correctly—he was **in charge**! This was God's way of saying to Satan, "In your face—I am competent to convert My children's suffering into blessing—anytime, anywhere—even in a prison! "

It's soothing to know that God is at the helm, especially in times of suffering, and far more comforting is that He has supreme veto power when something doesn't align with His plan for your life. Satan is acutely aware of this, but are you? If you are, then why hit the panic button when turbulence threatens to rattle your world? Of course, it's a normal physiological response for adrenaline to rise when something sudden happens, but we ought to stabilize in a flash by latching onto Scriptural promises such as, "...The Lord is my helper, I will not be afraid. What will man [or Satan for that matter] do to me?" (Hebrews 13:6). Or, "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). That's just what Job did when his foundation crumbled beneath him: "But He [the omniscient One] knows the way I take [why I am experiencing such turbulence]; when He has tried me [when this storm is over], I shall come forth as gold" (Job 23:10).

Now let's back up a step and look closer at

Genesis 39 verse 21 which states, "But the Lord was with Joseph, and extended kindness to him, and gave him favor in the sight of the chief jailer." Joseph was totally helpless in his dank prison cell. He couldn't bail himself out, nor could he escape—even if he wanted to! But in this dilemma, he was paid a visit by our Father's unfailing grace. God didn't immediately deliver him like He could have, but rather He caused him to be appointed second in command to the chief jailer! In a sense, a harder task than a miraculous deliverance! Think about it. Who said that God doesn't have a marvelous sense of humor? You see, God is capable of rescuing you from your predicament, just as much as He is capable of promoting you in the midst of it. But the very marrow of the verse we are studying is that God is the subject of each action:

- God was with Joseph (v. 21a)
- God extended kindness to Joseph (v. 21b)
- God gave Joseph favor [or grace] in the sight of the jailer (v. 21c).

The Lord does all the work—underlining the principle of grace. And there's no question about it. The very moment Joseph had a firm grasp of the truth that apart from God he would amount to nothing, his grace-orientation shone all about like bright moonlight. This is true of any believer who has an ounce of humility. When you inventory your life in light of God's grace, you understand that were it not for His grace, you wouldn't even be alive or be who you are today. This is the moment when truth begins to jell in your soul.

Chapter 39 ends with these amazing words, "...the Lord was with him [Joseph]; and whatever he did, **the Lord made [it] to prosper**" (v. 23). Literally, God was responsible for Joseph's every success even in the most adverse circumstance! Let me put it this way, God actually unleashed His shower of blessing upon Joseph—undeserving no less. Joseph's awareness of this Truth was the foundation of the super-structure of his spiritual life and the fountain of his grace-orientation. That same Truth ought to deflect ballooned-pride and cause us to look at our achievement under the high-powered microscope of God's grace.

JOSEPH'S ULTIMATE PROMOTION

We need to assemble together the accumulation of events that propelled Joseph to be the first Hebrew-slave-appointed prime minister of Egypt. Putting the pieces together is essential because it will throw more light on the work of the able, the "I know what I am doing" God! Keep in mind that Joseph's ultimate and long-awaited promotion is the third and final installment of, "And we know that God causes all things to work together for good to those who love God, to those who are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28).

Interestingly, the same Providence that presided over the boy-prince in Jacob's house, and shaped and guided his course, is the very one "causing all things |including imprisonment] to work together for [Joseph's awesome] good." We have heard Romans 8:28 quoted a thousand times, but does its Truth really circulate properly in our souls? Does its meaning register in the computer of our souls? When things go sour in our lives, can we unequivocally interpret the experience in light of this aweinspiring verse of the infallible Word of God? I mean, when we rationalize our suffering, do we THINK in terms of divine viewpoint that God knows what He is doing with our earthen vessels? Spiritual life, you know, is nothing but THINKING! THINKING! THINK-ING! We cannot emphasis this Truth enough! It's not what you do; it's what you think. Action is merely a by-product of one's thoughts! As we come to the end of this expositional teaching, we will see how Joseph rationalizes his entire experience from the onset of his brothers' callous action of selling him to the Ishmaelites as a slave, to his promotion as the prime minister of Egypt. So we begin with the setting.

GOD WORKS AT BOTH HELMS TO BRING ABOUT HIS ULTIMATE PLAN: We know that God is the Master Choreographer of human history and definitely the Mastermind in the planning. He knows when and how to use circumstancespleasant and unpleasant—to accomplish His overall plan for our lives. In fact, when we have an iron grip on this phenomenal concept, we will say good-bye to whining and mewing over our bitter experiences. We'll slam the book shut before we sing the "Why me" song. And there's no doubt about it, when this Truth arrests our thinking we'll be most relaxed inside and out just like Joseph—even in the midst of great turmoil. Yes, great turmoil.

The truth of the matter is that we cannot be winner believers apart from having a thorough understanding of God, His perfect

plan, and His way of doing things. We as believers often hit the panic button when suffering hits us between the eyes. This is because of our idiotic and stupid forgetfulness of Who is at the helm at both ends of our spiritual journey. We can learn how heroes of the past handled adversities. Job is a perfect example for our study; his soul was soaked in the river of God's Word as it was available to him in his day, through dreams, visions, and angelic teachings. He had a systematic comprehension of God. He understood, hands down, about God's omniscience, and far more fascinating, he had confidence in His God (Job 23:10). When Job was bombarded with severe suffering, he retreated to the bunker of doctrine in his soul and took cover with his bunker sealed off with a Pigeonhole of divine viewpoint. He viewed the outside world and his circumstances through this Pigeonhole! As suffering in its ugliness pressed so hard on him, he had no choice but to let divine viewpoint leak out of his soul! "But He knows [what I am going through; He knows why I am in this predicament]; when He has tried me [when he has tested the doctrine in my soul], I [am confident that I] will come forth [or shine] like gold" (Job 23:10).

You and I need to have such an attitude regarding suffering; and we need to have it more often! In light of this concept, an important question about our spiritual success has emerged: As believers in the Lord Jesus Christ who are growing in grace, do we truly rejoice when suffering knocks at our soul's door? Whenever we don't, we fall short of glorifying God. We are commanded in Scripture to, "Consider it all joy [rejoice!]...when [we] encounter various trials [or suffering] (James 1:2). We are told that our endurance will bring forth a marvelous result and super-abundance of unsurpassed blessing in time and eternity (vv. 4, 12). Joseph was aware of this doctrinal truth and because of this, he remained composed even in prison. True, he slipped off, but just for a moment. This clears the floor for us to enter another divine chamber of God's, in order that we might have some insight into His Providence.

GOD'S PROVIDENCE IN ACTION: "Then it came about after these things [Joseph's imprisonment and promotion in prison] the cupbearer [a palace official who serves wine at the king's table] and the baker for the king of Egypt offended their lord, the king of Egypt. And Pharaoh was furious with

his two officials, the chief cupbearer and the chief baker. So he put them in confinement in the house of the captain of the bodyguard, in the jail, the <u>same place where</u> Joseph was imprisoned" (Genesis 40:1-3).

Was it a coincidence that these two men where sent to the same prison where Joseph was jailed? Or was it on account of God's Providence that works behind the scenes? We have seen how God uses every circumstance in our life to accomplish His purpose. What we might call a disaster is a tool in the hand of God, for "God causes all things to work together for the [awesome] good of those who love Him." You may recall what happened in Shechem when a man found Joseph wandering about looking for his brothers (Genesis 37: 15, 16). This same man had overheard his brothers talking and directed Joseph to them. Coincidence? No! God's Providence caused the man to be at the right place at the right time! Was it mere chance that the Midianite traders happened to pass by just when Joseph's brothers had changed their minds and decided to sell him as a slave rather than leave him in the pit? (v. 28). Was that coincidence too? No! No! No! There are no coincidences in God's plan!

While God is not the source of evil deeds, He sure knows how to use them to His advantage! Tell me, do you think that Joseph's brothers would have sold him to the slave merchants if they had foreknown that they were sending him to a place where he would become a prime minister? Of course not! Tell me, again, If Satan had known that Job's blessings would double after he wiped him inside out, would he have attempted to obtain permission from God to torture Job? That's incongruous and unthinkable for the enemy of our progress to go that route! He couldn't have! Here is the supreme question: Tell me one more time, would Satan have fought relentlessly to have the Lord Jesus Christ crucified if he knew that Christ's spiritual death on the cross would result in unlimited atonement? No! No way! Not in a gazillion years! So my friend, when suffering strikes you where it hurts, do not fret, for God is poised, waiting to surprise Satan with a sensational outcome! That's the Truth of the Bible—it's the quintessence of God's incomprehensible grace! In a nutshell, it's God's perfect timing that the king's cupbearer and the baker not be decapitated or hanged. Rather, that they would share the same quarters with Joseph. Why is this significant? One of them will serve as a link between Joseph and the Egyptian king as we will see later on. Talk about Providence!

JOSEPH PORTRAYS HIS HUMILITY-**ORIENTATION**: Continuing in Genesis, we read: "And the captain of the bodyguard put Joseph in charge of them, and he took care of them; and they were in confinement for some time. Then the cupbearer and the baker for the king of Egypt, who were confined in jail, both had a dream the same night, each man with his own dream and each dream with its own interpretation. When Joseph came to them in the morning and **observed** them, behold they were **dejected** [Hebrew: za 'aph = sad or morose]. And he asked Pharaoh's officials who were with him in confinement in his master's house, 'Why are your faces so sad today?' Then they said to him, 'We have had a dream and there is no one to interpret it'" (40:4-8a).

We've defined humility as state of mind in which one regards himself as "Mr. Nobody of any significance" and easily and joyfully submits to any appointed authority. 1 Joseph's humility-orientation is clearly seen in his attitude toward those under his authority. Remember he was in charge of the prison inmates while being an inmate himself. Interestingly, the English Bible doesn't do enough justice in translating the Hebrew verb *sharath*. The translators rendered it 'took care' (40:4). It does mean to take care, but more than that it means, to attend, to serve, to wait on, or to minister to. It denotes a high level of service rendered to important people or royal officials. This term, which occurred 96 times in the Hebrew Old Testament, was used on many occasions to depict servitude in action. It was used as **service** provided by a household worker (I Kings 10:5); Elisha was said to have minis**tered** to his master Elijah (I Kings 19:21); King David's servants waited upon him (I Kings 1:15); in the same manner, Amnon had a valet who served him (II Samuel 13:17). The word is always used as a servant of a higher rank.

Joseph had the opportunity to show off his arrogance to the inmates under his authority,—after all, he was the boss! Rather, we see another side of Joseph—we see something so precious and attractive in him—humility. No wonder many Bible commentators maintain that Joseph was the foreshadow of Christ. We will explore this near the

end of our Biblical exposé. Joseph literally served them as though he was their household servant, which is similar to what our Lord did for His disciples. Now we can begin to tap further into the chamber of Joseph's soul and behold the beauty of amazing grace.

JOSEPH'S CONCERN FOR THE WELL-**BEING OF OTHERS**: Unselfish concern for the well-being of other people is a major weapon in the arsenal of grace. There are no two ways about it...show me a believer who is consumed with great passion for the well-being of others, and I will indisputably show you a grace believer! The apostle Paul put it beautifully: "Do nothing from selfishness or empty conceit, but with humility of mind let each of you regard one another as more important than himself; [and] do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interest of others" (Philippians 2:3,4). While Paul wrote this to the Philippians, he also set an example: "You [Ephesians] yourselves know that these hands [of mine] ministered to my own needs and to the men [his co-laborers] who were with me" (Acts 20:34). We have already delineated this Truth in our book: Paul: A Trophy of God's Grace.²

Joseph's attitude and concern toward others was no different than Paul's. And so Moses wrote, "When Joseph came to them [his fellow prison inmates in the morning and observed them, behold they were dejected" (Genesis 40:6). Joseph watched them like viewing a video, after all the Greek equivalent borao corresponds with the Latin video. He was acutely concerned about their facial expressions. Joseph could have looked the other way with a who-cares-attitude, but the Scripture recorded otherwise: "And he asked Pharaoh's officials who were with him in confinement in his master's house, 'Why are your faces so sad today?'" (v. 7). He asked them with the intention, if possible, to render assistance.

"Then they said to him, 'We have had a dream and there is no one to interpret it" (v. 8a). Joseph's heart melted with compassion, so he humbly asserted, "Do not interpretations belong to God? Tell it to me please" (v. 8b). What a man. He recognized that God is the source of everything he had—including his ability to interpret dreams! So the chief cupbearer and the baker told their dreams respectively to Joseph (w. 9-11); and he interpreted them

accordingly. We are not interested with their dreams as such, as they don't have any bearing on our study. Nonetheless, the interpretation of the cupbearer's dream was a favorable one, while his counterpart received bad news, which hinged on his eminent death. Consequently, Joseph's interpretations came to fruition respectively. Pharaoh had the chief baker executed on the third day as per Joseph's interpretation of the baker's dream (Genesis 40:16-20). Now we are ready to examine, though not in detail, the other side of the heroes of the Bible.

SPIRITUAL FAILURES: I have yet to see a Biblical hero who didn't have a smudge of spiritual failure in one way or another. The Old Sin Nature, which we all wear like a jacket, is the source of our personal sins or spiritual failures. Invariably, believers who dared to slide down the spiritual quagmire hill are those who have received above and beyond super grace—those who bore the mark of spiritual greatness. You may ask, Why do they have more potential to hit bottom over other believers? (Take for instance, Job, Abraham, King David, the apostle Paul, and a handful of others.) The reason is not hidden; they are the targets of Satan's elite warriors. Conversely, while Satan may slumber in attacking baby or carnal believers, he is vigilant 24 hours a day, 365 days a year in ambushing what I call 'Gold Believers!' We know of this from Satan's response to seven sons of Sceva, a Jewish chief priest, who were invoking the name of Jesus Christ on evil spirits. To these men Satan replied, "I recognize Jesus, and I know about Paul, but who [do you think you] are?" (Acts 19:14-15). In other words, I am too busy working around the clock to bring the 'Gold Believers' down; and I don't have any time to waste on you! I go after the spiritual, grace-made giants! Another reason Satan goes after these graced-out believers is that their failures draw much attention and can be a distraction to baby believers!

We all fail. No exceptions! Often, some of us who are self-righteous, like to sit high up, on a holy chair, and become judges of those who fail, without knowing the weight of the fatality of our error! We judge while ignoring and defying, outright, all orders from the Bar of Eternal Justice not to take part in such business! Sadly, the victims of this error are babies, self-centered, egocentric, arrogant believers who are legalistic to the core. These isolate certain sins and label them 'anathema', and whoever succumbs to

any of these sins should not be worthy of eternal life. To these believers, the apostle Paul asked a stinging question, "[Howbeit!] Who are you [who do you think you are] to judge the servant of another [God's]? To his own Master he stands or falls; and stand he will [guaranteed!], for the Lord is able to make him stand" (Romans 14:4).

James, the half-brother of our Lord lamented, "Do not speak against one another, brethren. He who speaks against a brother, or judges his brother, speaks against the law, and judges the law; but if you judge the law, you are not a doer of the law, but [the Law Giver, i.e. God]. There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, the One who is able to save and destroy, but who are you who judge your [brother]" (James 4:11,12). Dangerously, some of us have made ourselves into small gods, and we are busybodies patrolling God's territory to judge his employees. Such a lifestyle does not reflect grace-orientation! Never has, and never will—not then, not now, and not ever! When a believer fails, no matter how heinous, the function of our priesthood requires that we lift such a person up in prayer before the throne of God's grace—interceding on his behalf. We ought not to cause other believers to sin by drawing them in the middle of gossip, maligning, judging, and ridicule. We are not to judge others because we do not have all the facts surrounding the person's failure, only God does!

A believer's failure today ought not to be a joking matter in that you don't have the slightest idea what kind of failure awaits you tomorrow. I thank my God, that He has graciously taught me a great lesson not to judge anyone, no matter what. Experience is the best teacher, they say; how true it is. I watched a very humorous commercial about people getting a daily dose of vitamins by eating cereal every morning. In the commercial, a man laughs at his friends when he sees a waiter serve many different kinds of cereal—perhaps twelve bowls for each. He ordered another brand of cereal; however, he doesn't have any idea how many bowls it will take to get his complete daily vitamins. Suddenly, the waiter returns with twice as many bowls as the others have. Seeing his own bowls, his friends burst out laughing, and his facial expression changes as he asks them, "What's funny?" Now he is asking, "What's funny?" forgetting that he is the one who first laughed at them. So my friend, don't take it lightly when your brother in Christ fails, because you have no idea what awaits you on the grounds of spiritual warfare! We all need grace in abundance! With this little, but necessary, digression from our exposition, we can now look at Joseph's failure.

JOSEPH'S FAILURE: First of all, nowhere in all of Scripture are we told that Joseph was a perfect believer, or anyone else for that matter. Momentarily, Joseph switched from divine viewpoint to human viewpoint. So we read, "Then Joseph said to him [the chief cupbearer], 'This is the interpretation of it [your dream]: the three branches are three days; within three more days Pharaoh will lift up your head and restore you to your office; and you will put Pharaoh's cup into his hand according to your former custom when you were his cupbearer. Only keep me in mind when it goes well with you, and please do me a kindness by mentioning me to Pharaoh, and get me out this **[jail] house**. For I was in fact kidnapped from the land of the Hebrews, and even here I have done nothing that they should have put me into the dungeon" (vv. 12-15).

Without any doubt, Joseph really missed the spiritual mark at this juncture. All along, throughout his adverse experiences, as we have previously studied, he was focused on God, who in His grace rescues the righteous—those who suffer injustice. But here he really snapped! The word translated 'kindness' is the Hebrew *chesed*. It means kindness, but more than that, it's the attitude of good will, favor, and love, which contains mercy, or grace in action. Joseph inadvertently placed himself under a divine curse, or discipline that would last two more years. He fainted and slammed his trust on man, which carries punitive action from the Bar of Eternal Justice: "Thus says the Lord, 'Cursed is the man who trusts in mankind and make flesh his strength, and whose heart turns away from the Lord" (Jeremiah 17:5). The Psalmist echoed Jeremiah's words with a song, "Do not trust in princes, in mortal man, in whom there's no [deliverance]" (Psalm 146:3). Joseph failed miserably when he switched his trust in God to man. He whined and mewed about his unjust treatment. Job did the same. Remember our job is not to say, "Joseph, how dare you switch your trust in God to man?" We do not have a clue as to the magnitude of his suffering, just as we don't have a clue about Job's. The good news is that God has, and judges graciously. You may be tempted to call one a loser, while in God's evaluation he's a winner! No question about it, Joseph clearly failed God at this point. But the BIG QUESTION is, did God fail him? Stay tuned, because when this question is answered in conjunction with a brief study of God's faithfulness, I am sure that a tangible understanding of grace will hit you between the eyes!

FINAL THOUGHT

We are reminded that our position in Christ is by grace all the way. The apostle Paul wrote, "But by His doing [minus anyone's effort] you are in Christ Jesus..." (I Corinthians 1:30a). God is perfect and His work is perfect. God the Son purchased you (I Peter 1:18, 19)—eternal transaction. God the Holy Spirit sealed you (II Corinthians 1:22)—eternal sealing. God the Father keeps you saved by His power (John 10:29)—eternal security. God provides salvation in grace, we have nothing to add. We are the objects and beneficiaries of His grace forever.

"Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling [losing your salvation], and to make you stand in the presence of His glory blameless with great joy, to the only God our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen" (Jude 1:24-25).

THE DOCTRINE OF KENOSIS

CHRIST'S RESTRICTION OF THE USE OF HIS DEITY IN HIS HUMAN NATURE: We have already delineated the issue of Christ restricting the use of His Deity in His human nature. We noted that the apostle Paul pointed this out when he wrote to the Philippians, saying, "Who although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, "But **emptied** [restricted] Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death even death on the cross" (Philippians 2:6-8). Again, either He used His Deity in His incarnation or He did not. There are no two ways about it. There is no such thing as partial restriction in Philippians 2:6, this is exactly the point we want to drive home. The question stands: Did Christ in His humanity ever use the attributes of His Deity?

We have already laid the groundwork by showing that Christ, the last Adam, was a real live human being with flesh and blood; the Scriptural support abounds. As a Man, He increased in wisdom (Luke 2:52), grew in stature (Luke 2:52), experienced hunger (Matthew 4:2), was tired (John 4:6), thirsty (John 4:7), and wept (John 11:35)...an expression of human emotion. As God, those experiences were foreign to Him. Invariably, it was necessary that He become a true human being so that His qualification as a Witness in the prosecution phase of the appeal trial of Satan would be unquestionable. Satan would not go back to the court room, and say to God the Father, "I told You so or that no human being can subject himself to God's authority without God's bribery." Christ Himself defended this Truth, when He said, "I can do nothing on my own [accord]...I do not seek My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me" (John 5:30). We now have another chunk of evidence to add to our arsenal of Truth.

RELIANCE ON HIS FATHER'S WILL AND **PROVISION**: The phrase "I Will" emphasizes what one can do by 'will power.' On the contrary, Jesus Christ relied on, and utilized to the maximum, two power sources throughout His earthly ministry. We will come to these dynamic Powers later on. Suffice it to say, this solemn statement, which our Lord made in John 5:30 is seen throughout His earthly ministry. He began His ministry by consulting His Father in prayer (Luke 3:21, 22); when He chose His disciples, He asked God for guidance (Luke 6:12,13); He prayed to the Father when He was engaging in sustained and exhausted service (Mark 1:35-39); when He called forth Lazarus from the dead, He looked to the Father for a miracle (John 11:41); when He was burdened for Peter, He couldn't say, 'Alright, Peter, Satan has obtained permission to twist your spiritual momentum, you need

not to worry, for I have everything under control.' Rather He prayed to the Father on Peter's behalf (Luke 22:31, 32). When He faced betrayal, execution, and divine abandonment, He looked to the Father for strength (Luke 22:41,44). That's not all! When He thought of His disciples' future ministry, He lifted them up in prayer to the Father (John 17).

Some one may ask, "What about those miracles that Jesus Christ did, didn't He do them by the power of His Deity?" No. He performed those miracles through the power of the Holy Spirit, or better, God the Father wrought those miracles through Him to attest to the unbelieving Jews, that Jesus Christ is truly Whom He claimed to be—the Messiah! In Acts we read, "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a Man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourself know" (2:22). Even Nicodemus acknowledged that when he said to Jesus Christ, "...Rabbi, we know that You have come from God as a teacher; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with Him" (John 3:2). You say, "Well, there were many occasions when Jesus Christ performed miracles at will without consulting His Father." Sure. So did the apostles, especially the apostle Paul and Peter respectively. On the other hand, He could have operated in the power of His deity; after all, He is God; however because of the reason we gave earlier, He chose to do otherwise.

(August 2003)

NAIROBI

Moses often leaves his hotel at 9:00 a.m. only to return around 7:00 p.m. He expounded the Scripture with clarity and perspicacity so that those who attended had little room to argue or challenge him on doctrinal issues. Sometimes he would speak for more than three and half hours non-stop stressing that salvation is faith plus nothing, minus nothing, faith alone in Christ alone! He presented the gospel and basic Truth in a most challenging manner.

HERE ARE THE HIGHLIGHTS OF THIS CONFERENCE:

- ✓ There were people from six other African countries.
- ✓ Some traveled three days by bus to come to the Nairobi evangelistic meeting.
- ✓ Immediately following the program, more than a dozen pastors formed a group for the purpose of listening to basic doctrines on audiotape.
- ✓ After the meeting one of the ministers, who preaches falsehood on a national radio, could no longer preach because he has been exposed to the Truth!
- ✓ Those who came from outside Kenya pleaded with Moses to come to their countries.
- ✓ One minister from a French speaking country who attended the program had already completed the translation of one of GEM's publications in both French and Swahili.

KISUMU

Pastor John who pleaded with Rev. Moses to come to his town was the main organizer. Within three days he had mobilized his town! Moses traveled for about six hours by bus from Nairobi to Kisumu. When he got there around 2:00 p.m., he asked John when the meeting would begin. John said, "Now." Moses had no choice, but to change his clothes and off he went. When he arrived at the hall, it was packed after only three days of mobilization! Again, the Holy Spirit glorified God the Father through him. Being tireless, he spoke for over three hours at a stretch and his translator began yowling, causing Moses to call for a break!

HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✓ The teaching was well received.
- ✓ The attendees urged that Rev. Moses stay for perhaps two more days.
- ✓ One pastor testified: "I have learned so much in this meeting, more than I've learned in three years of my seminary training."
- ✓ People are eagerly waiting for Moses' next return 'God willing.'

At the end of the meeting in Kisumu, 'Bishop' Alex, the man Moses met on the airplane, who has 162 churches, picked up Moses and Naboth. He took Moses and company to cities and villages in rural areas. Moses had all kinds of enjoyable experiences, having been prepared in advance as a native of Africa. They drove through potholes, mud, and even rode on a bicycle! In some remote areas, their only mode of transportation is bicycle.

HIGHLIGHTS:

- ✓ There were people who came to the saving knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- ✓ 'Bishop' Alex confirmed that their meeting on the airplane was God-ordained!
- ✓ He invited Moses for the international conference next June!
- ✓ The 'Bishop' Alex concluded by saying, 'I know that God doesn't make a mistake. My inviting Rev. Moses C. Onwubiko is never a mistake."

UNITED KINGDOM

(September 2003)

When Rev. Moses mentioned to some people that he had an invitation to minister in England, the people were flabbergasted, "England!" "What's in England?" some asked. But for whatever it's worth, the invitation is part of divine planning. It appears that England has hit rock bottom and is now beginning to look for a spiritual solution. It's my assumption that England and the rest of the world are tired of religion and are now embracing a grace message with alacrity. "Go into all the world and preach the good news to all creation " (Mark 16:15)

WE HAVE THE FOLLOWING OBJECTIVES:

Objective #1

Evangelize unbelievers with the simple, grace gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We will depend solely on the sovereignty of the Holy Spirit to make the gospel clear without resorting to gimmicks or imposing our personal views on others. We must present the gospel, but leave the decision "to believe in" or "to reject" Christ to the hearers.

Objective #2

For those who choose to believe in Christ, we will seize the opportunity to assist in the following ways:

a. Help them form Bible study groups;

- b. Provide them with doctrinal materials, including recorded Bible lessons and literature, enabling them to fulfill the command: "As newborn babies desire the sincere milk of the word [sound Bible doctrine] that you may grow thereby." (I Peter 2:2);
- c. Where possible, assist them in establishing their own local churches;
- d. Help them select pastors who teach sound Bible doctrine; and
- e. As the Lord makes funds available, provide financial assistance until they are self-supporting.

Objective #3

Because those who have responded to the gospel will become unfruitful if they are not exposed to sound Bible teaching, we will seek out or establish theological seminaries to prepare indigenous pastors. Their training will be consistent with Paul's mandate to Pastor Timothy to "study to show yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the Word of truth." (II Timothy 2: 15)

Objective #4

As the need arises, we will send doctrinally motivated, short-term and long-term missionaries to minister to newly formed groups and churches.

Objective #5

We will use literature and other media to reach and nurture those to whom we cannot minister in person. To minimize expenses, we will establish overseas centers for audiocassette duplication of recorded Bible lessons and reproduction of doctrinal literature. He prayed when He thought of His disciples and their future ministry (John 17) and before His physical death (Luke 23:46). Therefore, if you are a believer who finds it difficult to spend a time with our heavenly Father, sin no more. "Far be it from me that I should sin against the Lord by ceasing to pray for you" (1 Samuel 12:23).
